
ACTIVITY

The ashes imposed on the head are intended to remind us that we are dust; we are from the earth and will return to the earth. This year, go to your yard, garden, farm, or a nearby park and collect some soil in a cup or small bowl. Bring your soil back inside. Place your fingers in the soil; dig around and hold some in your hand. As you do, speak aloud the following:

PRAYER OF ASHES

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, so that we may remember that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.





LENT IN PLAIN SIGHT

Throughout the season you'll have several opportunities to collect everyday objects, starting with the soil you gathered today. Choose a place in your home or workplace to build an altar with these objects, adding to it from week to week. Allow the soil to remind you that even from dirt, new life is nourished and grown.
